RULES

Open to children aged 16 years and under on 31st August, 2020

Age will be taken into consideration in every class and should be displayed on the **FRONT** of the exhibit.

Name and school on the reverse of entry.

All entries to be the unaided work of the competitor.

The rules and regulations printed in the main schedule also apply.

In each class points will be awarded as follows: -

1 st	4 points	£2.00 prize money
2 nd	3 points	£1.50 prize money
3 rd	2 points	£1.00 prize money
4 th	1 point	(no prize money)

The North Yorkshire County Show Junior Cup will be awarded to the exhibitor aged 11 years and under on 31st August, 2020 who gains the most points overall in the Junior Schedule. The trophy will be held for one year.

The North Yorkshire County Show Perpetual Challenge Trophy will be awarded to the exhibitor aged 12-16 years on 31st August, 2020 who gains the most overall points in the Junior Schedule. The trophy will be held for one year.

The Abbeyfield Children's Exhibit Award, kindly donated by Maxwell's of Northallerton, will be presented to the painting entry judged to be the best in show. The award will be held for one year. The painting will be exhibited at Abbeyfield House, Northallerton for the residents to enjoy.

The Victoria Pattison Trophy will be awarded to the best overall exhibit in class 512. The trophy will be held for one year. (i.e. Painting 5 years and under)
